Introduction

Please take time to review the information in this guide. This information will help you follow the rules for entering Canada safely and be prepared for life in Canada.

Our top priority is the health and safety of our students, host families, schools, and communities. We must still follow the regulations and recommendations of the Canadian and provincial governments, and the local public health authority. **The updated entry regulations below, are subject to change. Up-to-date information can be found here.**

Please note, to enter Canada:

- As always, travel documents <u>are</u> required: Passport, 'Immigration Canada Letter of Acceptance for a Study Permit,' eTA, or Visitors Visa. (If you are a RETURNING student, make sure you have your Study Permit with you.)
- Proof of COVID-19 vaccination is not required
- COVID-19 pre-entry and arrival tests are not required
- Quarantine after you enter Canada is not required
- Using ArriveCAN is not required
 - To save time at the border, you can still use ArriveCAN to complete your customs and immigration declaration before flying into Canada. Visit <u>ArriveCAN</u>: <u>Advance CBSA</u>
 Declaration for the list of participating international airports.

- Health checks to board planes, trains, and ferries are not required
- Wearing masks on planes, trains, and ferries is **not required**
 - o It is still recommended that you wear a well fitted mask while you travel.

If you have symptoms of COVID-19, you should not travel to Canada.

If you feel sick or experience any symptoms of COVID-19 during your travel to Canada or upon arrival, you should put on a face mask and:

- as per Canadian government guidelines, you are to inform the flight attendant or a border services officer upon arrival. You may be referred to a Quarantine Officer for a health assessment and further direction.

While in Canada monitor your health for possible symptoms of COVID-19. If you are not feeling well be sure to alert your homestay host. Check out the BC COVID-19 Self-Assessment Tool here. Call 811 if you are very sick and your symptoms are not improving.

Pre-Departure

Step 1 - Get to Know Your Homestay Family

- 1. Contact your Homestay family to get to know them. A video chat using Zoom, WhatsApp or WeChat is a good way. Remember to exchange emails, cell phone numbers, and WhatsApp numbers with your host family. Set up a text chat with your Homestay host before departure.
- 2. If you have not already added the following Nanaimo Ladysmith International Program Emergency numbers in your phone, please make sure you do! Also please add the Homestay Coordinator from your assigned Canadian school. While travelling to Nanaimo, you can find us all on WHATSAPP (+1)

Be sure to share your flight information and arrival times with your Homestay family AND <u>ise@sd68.bc.ca</u> as soon as possible. If there are last minute changes in your flights and arrival times, please inform both your Homestay host and email <u>ise@sd68.bc.ca</u>

Step 2 — A Canadian Phone Plan — For your personal safety, it is an ISE requirement to have a Canadian phone plan with data, for the duration of your stay in our program. In the event you need to access a Mobile Doctor, for medical help, you need a Canadian phone number. (Mobile Doctor will NOT work with WhatsApp!)

We recommend you set up a phone plan for use in Canada before you leave your home country. Many international students in BC use PhoneBox but you can use any phone plan provider you choose if it is a Canadian plan with data. We have found that PhoneBox is the most convenient for international students to sign up for, because it does not require an adult to co-sign with a credit card. (Please note your homestay family cannot sign for this service.) Also, it is very simple to end the services with PhoneBox.

PhoneBox offers plans for \$35/month + 12% taxes. There is also a 1-time SIM card fee but using the link below will waive that charge.

It is best to set up a phone plan **prior to departure** to ensure you have access to your phone once you arrive in Canada.

You can use an e-SIM or have your physical sim card delivered to your Homestay address, so it is ready for you when you arrive. We recommend that you use the e-SIM service. An e-SIM card is simple to use – you will be emailed a unique QR code.



Step 3 – Student Finances

Please discuss with your bank advisor, family, agent and/or students who have previously travelled in Canada about the best student banking card options for international travel to Canada. Your country's bank card may not always work in Canada. (Several students from Türkiye, Spain, and Brazil have had issues with their bank card.) It is recommended that students use a chip-based debit card from Visa or Mastercard. Some services such as fitness gyms no longer accept cash and require students to pay with Canadian credit card. If your credit or debit card does not work in Canada, we can help you set up a Canadian bank account with a Canadian debit card once you arrive. This is free for students.

Step 4 -Packing - Be sure to check with your airline on weight limits for your carry on and checked baggage.

Safe Travel Practices For All Students

While travelling to the airport, in airports and during flights:

Wear a Mask and Wash Your Hands

It is recommended you wear a mask. Wash your hands before you board the airplane and continuously use hand sanitizer. Touch as few surfaces as possible.



Keep Safe

When you get to your airplane seat it is a good idea to wipe it, and your meal tray, with a disinfectant wipe. Keep your cell phone charged in case you need to contact your host family. Bring some snacks in your carry-on bag.

Arriving in Canada

You finally made it! You will need to clear Canada Immigration and Customs before heading to your next flight on your journey to Nanaimo. Follow the passengers on your flight, as they are heading to Immigration as well. If you are uncertain where to go, ask an airport employee.

To prepare for Immigration, have the following documents ready:

- Your Passport, or eTA or Visitor Visa, or Immigration Canada 'Letter of Acceptance for a Study Permit' OR Study Permit (if you are a returning student.)
 - If you have an Immigration Canada 'Letter of Acceptance for a Study Permit', this is where you will receive your Study Permit. The barcode on this letter MUST be scanned while you are at the Immigration area. It is very important you do not leave the Immigration Area until you have your Study Permit.

Arriving in Nanaimo

Welcome to Vancouver Island!

- You will be greeted at the Nanaimo Airport or BC Ferry Terminal by a member of your Homestay family or an ISE staff member. Please keep your Homestay family updated on the status of your arrival. It will be easy to find your family or the ISE staff member as we have a small friendly airport.
- Gather your luggage, sanitize your hands, and get ready to say hello!

Participate in New Student Orientation Activities!

New Student Orientation Activities will take place during the last week of August 30th – September 1st. All new students will participate in an ISE Program Orientation and a School Orientation. Students will get to

meet their Homestay Coordinator, School Advisor, and program staff. Most importantly, students will get to meet each other! Important information will be shared, and social connections will be encouraged.

New Student Orientation

<u>The ISE Program Orientation: August 30th and August 31st</u> – learn about our schools, community, and Vancouver Island. Other topics will include International Student activities & excursions, transportation, health services & safety, and program rules. Students and their homestays will be given specific date and time of the ISE Program Orientation session upon arrival in Nanaimo and Ladysmith.

<u>School Orientation:</u> – learn about your assigned school, your course schedule, school expectations and culture, our computer systems (Google Classroom, Learn68, etc.) and school activities. Times and details about School Orientations vary based on the students' school, but most will take place on Friday, September 1st.

If your flight is delayed, Do Not Worry! We will ensure you will receive the Program and School Orientation at an alternate time and date.

Other Important Information:

Playing Community or Club Soccer in Canada

Many of our international students who love to play soccer have asked how they can continue to play soccer while in Canada. The good news, in addition to school soccer, the Nanaimo Ladysmith communities have great soccer organizations that provide opportunities for you to play soccer during your stay in Nanaimo Ladysmith.

There are two great soccer organizations in our communities offering recreational and competitive soccer for all students, from September to March and a May/June Season as well.

Nanaimo United Football Club offers competitive and recreational soccer opportunities for boys and girls...

BC Surf Soccer has room for ages 14+ for girls and boys interested in playing competitive soccer.

Both clubs are governed by FIFA regulations and students need to obtain an **International Transfer Certificate.**This process can take anywhere from 2 weeks to two months, and students are unable to play in games with NUFC or BC Surf Soccer until the forms have been approved by Canada Soccer.

Step 1 Visit the two websites above and discuss with your parents if you want to apply to play club soccer while in Canada. If the answer is Yes, proceed to Step 2.

Step 2. Notify our department at <u>ise@sd68.bc.ca</u> of your intention and which club you would like to join. **The DEADLINE for this notification is July 10th, 2023!**

Step 3. Start preparing your application package:

a. Compile the information to complete the following table:

- b. Obtain a colour scan of Player's Passport (photo page)
- c. Obtain a colour scan of Player's Birth Certificate
- d. Obtain a colour scan of both Parents' Passport (photo page)
- e. Obtain a letter from Home Country Football Association stating whether the player has ever been registered with a member club, and if yes, was the player amateur or professional. This letter is required even if the student never played club soccer in their home country.

Step 4. All students who notified our office that they were interested in playing community soccer (Step 2) by July 10th, will be contacted by our offices no later than Monday, July 17th with how and when to submit your application to play soccer.
